Lois N. Epstein, P.E. has worked for Cook Inlet Keeper as a Senior Engineer and an Oil and Gas Industry Specialist since 2001. Previously she worked for Environmental Defense (formerly Environmental Defense Fund) in Washington, D.C. on pollution prevention and measuring industrial environmental performance. Prior to these positions, Lois worked for two private consulting firms and the U.S. EPA Region 9 Office of Water. Currently she works to improve the performance of the oil and natural gas infrastructure in Alaska's Cook Inlet watershed and to prevent new oil and gas development in sensitive areas through research, writing, and speaking. She has presented invited testimony before the U.S. Congress on eight occasions, including twice representing Cook Inlet Keeper. Lois is a licensed Professional Engineer in the States of Alaska and Maryland and is a member of the federal Office of Pipeline Safety's advisory committee on hazardous liquid pipelines. She has a masters degree from Stanford University in Civil Engineering with a specialization in environmental engineering and science, and undergraduate degrees from both Amherst College (in English) and MIT (in mechanical engineering). President Clinton nominated Lois in October 2000 to the Chemical Safety and Hazard Investigation Board, however the U.S. Senate did not vote on her nomination before the end of the 106th Congress.
